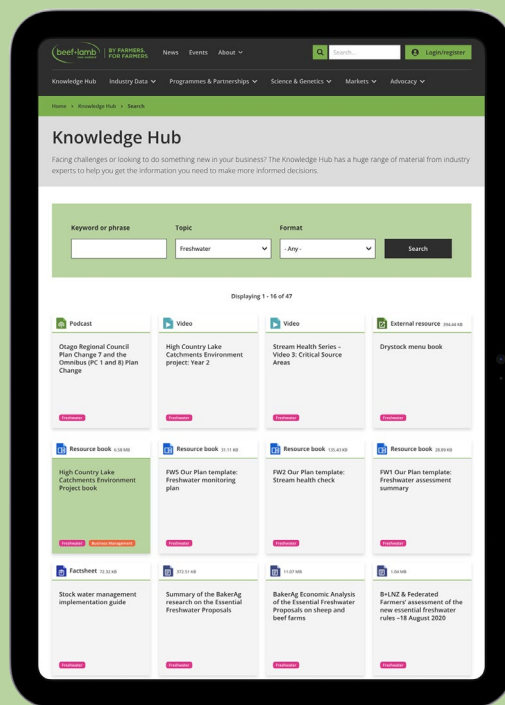

ANIMAL MANAGEMENT

Beef Cow Body Condition Scoring—The critical elements of condition scoring in beef cows and management applications.

Ewe Body Condition Scoring—A quick, easy and low-cost management tool that compares sheep purely on condition.

Better Beef Breeding—How to make the best use of genetic information when purchasing bulls for breeding purposes.

Better Sheep Breeding—How to assess the genetic merit of rams, and identify breeders that will help you achieve your objectives, to improve your flock's performance.

Growing Great Lambs—Efficient lamb production and feed use, which ultimately translates into profit.

FeedSmart—Assess the quality of feed and estimate its metabolisable energy. Become a star at pasture management.

Wormwise—The latest information and research on internal parasite control is presented.

BUSINESS AND STRATEGY

Farm Safety Management System—This workshop provides you with a Farm Safety Management System. This gives you a process for identifying and managing hazards and risks and 90% of your paperwork already done.

Protecting your Patch Workshop—Farmers will leave the workshop with a clear understanding of biosecurity interventions they need to take within their own operation and the importance of excellent on-going biosecurity practices for their industry

Generation Next Workshop—This programme is designed to nurture, assist and encourage the current and future farmers within our sector.

ENVIRONMENT

Trees within Farms—Opportunities to integrate trees within farms to benefit sheep and cattle farming and the farm environment, and at the same time generate a return from production forestry, from the ETS, and/or localised tree-planting or land-retirement funding programmes.

Freshwater—This interactive workshop will help to introduce you to some simple tools to measure key indicators of freshwater quality and ecosystems.

Winter grazing—This workshop brings together all the winter grazing resources developed in recent years around managing livestock and crops to minimise the environmental impacts of this practice.

Farm Plan: Environment Module—Workshops with a strong practical focus, covering soils, freshwater, biodiversity, climate change, forage cropping and more.

The strength of a workshop approach is access to expert knowledge and the ability to share with and learn from other farmers addressing the same issues as you. The technical content of the environment module will be delivered through two, five-hour workshops with no cost to farmers to attend. By attending these workshops farmers will be able to create much of their environmental farm plan.
