What is Agribusiness?

Agribusiness is an integrated subject at Year 12 and 13 that provides an understanding of New Zealand's primary products throughout the entire value chain, predominantly beyond the farm gate. It is taught across all primary industry sector contexts with concepts from business, technology and science, such as innovation, value added, sustainability, management and finance, and future proofing.





What is the Agribusiness in Schools Programme?

The Agribusiness in Schools programme teachers, and students, to enable

Agribusiness in Schools aims to:

- Provide a better understanding of what the primary sector is.
- Change the image of agriculture that it is exciting, dynamic and a "passport to the world"
- Better engagement with the urban sector.
- Highlight the career opportunities that the primary sector provides.

- Meet the needs of the primary sector now and in the future.
- Address economic growth and employment in a dynamic, evolving global environment.
- Get students at secondary school level to be moving into the tertiary agriculture education.
- Improve secondary tertiary sector links.































Achievements to Date

In 2024, there were 125 12 and 13.

Agribusiness in Schools students are;

- 3.6 times more likely to be enrolled in related tertiary training than nonagribusiness students
- 3 times more likely to be employed in the primary sector than nonagribusiness students.

- Agribusiness in Schools shows the success of providing early exposure to students for agriculture as a training or career pathway
- Agribusiness in Schools has effectively extended its reach beyond traditional rural communities, engaging students who previously had minimal exposure to the agricultural sector, demonstrating its success in making agricure accessible and appealing to a broader audience.
- 64% rural schools and 36% urban schools.
