- Must reside or have a strong connection to the Mid-Northern North Island Farmer Council region.

Open to individuals pursuing but not limited to:

- Tertiary education
- Primary Industry training, courses and programs.
- Personal development or leadership courses relevant to the agricultural sector.
- All ages and career stages welcome—whether you're just starting out or looking to upskill.

Selection Criteria:

- Demonstrated commitment to the New Zealand sheep and beef sector.
- Clear goals for how the scholarship will support professional or personal development.
- A personal statement on how the applicant intends to contribute to the sector in the future.
