Selection Criteria:

- Actively working on a sheep & beef or dry stock property (associated levy payers)
- Aged between 18 & 45 years' old
- Willingness to learn new skills and understand the drivers to improving on farm profitability of the sheep and beef sector.
- Priority will be given to those farming and living within the Southern South Island area (Dunedin South)
 - Should there be places left after this outside application will be considered.
- Goals are listed and suggest that they will stay within the primary industry
- Have a plan 5-10 years out that they would like to achieve
- Application shows progression over time through positions or goals represent this
- Have not completed a degree in Ag Science or Ag Commerce at a tertiary institution like that of Lincoln or Massey universities in the past 5 years
- If completed a diploma or certificate in the past, that business or a finance paper was only a minor part
